March 23–25, 2020 | State College, Pa.

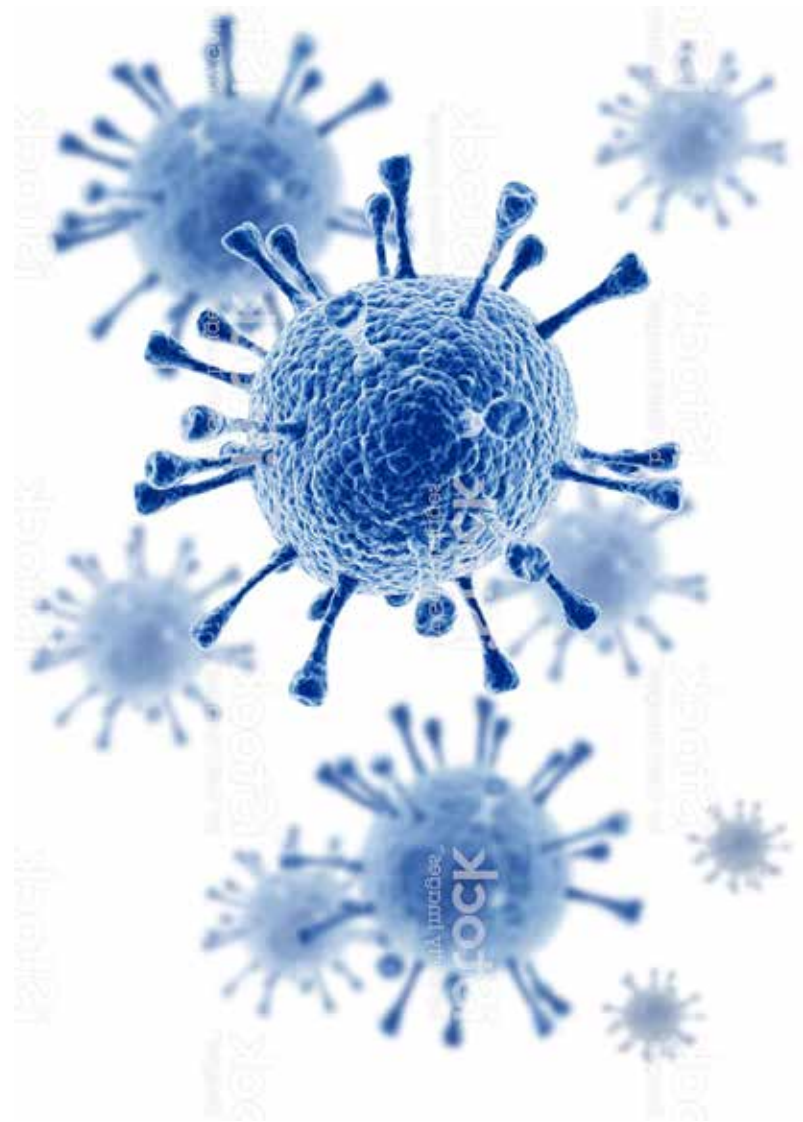

The goal of the conference is to highlight current successes and lessons learned from past experiences combatting foreign animal diseases as well as explore new areas for action, preparedness and response. We hope to reach on-farm decisionmakers, including veterinarians, farm owners, extension, state and federal regulators, and industry representatives in this 2.5 day conference.
